



First-time students add \$370 Orientation fee. **The total cost for resident students is based on 14 meals per week and a standard multiple occupancy room. The plan including 17 meals per week would increase the cost by \$745. A single occupancy room would increase the total cost by \$2,475. Additional fees may apply. ***PAL Fee (if applicable) is \$7,350 (credit bearing) and \$7,180 (non-credit bearing) additional to the full-time tuition rate noted above and \$3,870 for supportive PAL.
